## Our initiatives include

- Updating activities to allow for differentiation for EVERY student across the learning continuum from year 4 to year 12.
- Build teacher capacity with Professional Development focused on improving differentiation strategies made by RBSLEC. This will allow RBSLEC to support every student succeeding.

## Our school will improve student outcomes by

- Purchasing program equipment for Team building and Obstacle activities (\$4000) to differentiate for year 4 to year 12 students.
- Professional Development sessions (\$1362) that upskill staff in the best practices for their interactions and guided learning opportunities with students.
